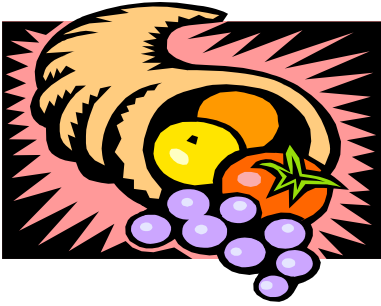

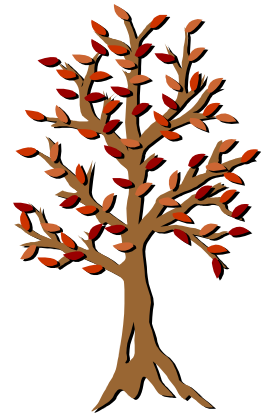
We voted to accept FAA Nancy Haugarth's offer of plastic bags for our "goodie bags".

# Career Fair at West Charleston Library



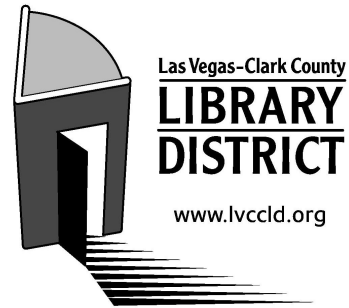
